**DG Mark's Monthly Message**

But then a snow storm showed up. Unexpected, particularly as to its severity, the storm closed roads and created hazardous driving conditions, especially in those places I needed to be. Now I hate to quit on something, especially when I've helped to put it together, but it looked like I was going to have to stay home. So I contacted the folks heading to Western Greenwich. To no surprise, these Lions held the Open House anyway, and were able to attract some new members despite the bad weather. The Westport event was completely cancelled, so we'll get another chance in February to gather the troops. But after e-mailing the prospective Lions that the event was off, I received many notes back saying that they were still very firmly behind the efforts to charter the club, and would be there next time. These messages made me feel great, knowing that we have already made a strong case for the Westport Lions becoming a reality soon.

Our Lions can be a persistent bunch. Anyone who has been involved in growing membership, forming new clubs, retaining members and teaching our Lions to lead know this to be true. ## **UPDATE FROM CABINET AND COUNCIL MEETINGS**

Lots of news from around the District and the Multiple District over the past month. Of course most of the talk has been about Mid-Winter (see more below). At the time of this “printing” nearly 400 Lions and guests were registered, so it promises to be another excellent event. At the January 11<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting, I delivered all the new Cabinet uniform items (ties, scarves and pocket squares). These items will be for sale on Saturday only at Mid-Winter. The most important piece of information is that the Lions of Connecticut have been given an opportunity to run a candidate for election as International Director in Seattle, WA in 2011. What that means is that the three Districts will each be holding separate conventions to elect a single candidate, and then a special Multiple District Convention will be held in November to select one of the three candidates for run for International Director. I have appointed an Ad Hoc Convention Committee to help coordinate these activities, and to ensure that District 23A complies with all By-law requirements. Only Past District Governors are eligible to run for International Director, and all have been so notified in writing. Those Lions who wish to seek the District 23A endorsement will have an opportunity to campaign within the District, so please be sure to give them a forum. There will be more information coming out to the District soon, so stay tuned.

## **UPDATE ON EXTENSION PROJECTS**

The Shelton Community Lions Club charter application was received at LCI in late December, and we are anxiously awaiting the formal Charter notification so that the Charter Night celebration plans can be finalized. I would like to congratulate Charter President Lion Frank Yaworowski, Charter Secretary Deidre Kennedy, Charter Treasurer Dave Haddad, Charter Membership Chair Tom Kennedy, and Charter Tail Twister Dave Zamba for stepping up to assume these important club leadership roles. The entire District looks forward to celebrating with you and you club members very soon.

A “meet and greet” in coordination with the Westport/Weston Chamber of Commerce on January 28<sup>th</sup> got postponed due to inclement weather, so a mid-day gathering will be scheduled in early February. We’re confident that this club will be chartered soon, and your collective assistance will go a long way to make that a reality.

### **PEACE POSTER UPDATE**

Last month, I announced that 12-year old Choiwing Yeung, a 7<sup>th</sup> grader from Walter P. Polson Middle School in Madison (and sponsored by the Madison Lions Club) had been selected as both the District 23A and Multiple District 23 Peace Poster Contest winner. Ms. Yeung's original artwork incorporating the "Power of Peace" theme was sent on to Lions Clubs International, and on January 26<sup>th</sup>, word came out from LCI that she had been selected as one of 23 International Merit Award winners!

According to LCI's e-mail to Madison Lions President Barry Miller, "approximately 350,000 children from 65 countries participated in this year's Peace Poster Contest. The posters were judged at club, district and multiple district levels before reaching the international level, at which point they had been narrowed down to 121 posters. Based on creativity, originality and portrayal of the theme, "The Power of Peace," your club's entry was chosen as one of 23 merit award winners. As such, your club's sponsored student will receive US\$500 and a certificate of merit."

This is incredible news; something all Lions can be proud of. Those of us who participated in the judging knew we had a very special piece of artwork, and it's wonderful to see that LCI agrees. Ms. Yeung and her family will be our guests at the luncheon during Mid-Winter, and a copy of the poster will be on display. As if you need another reason to go to Mid-Winter??
